

## **A Faith That Overcomes**

Hebrews 11 reminds us that God's people have always overcome by faith. Moses' parents trusted God more than they feared Pharaoh. Moses chose the reproach of God's people over the treasures of Egypt. Let us not simply admire the faith of Moses, Israel, Rahab, and the faithful of old. Let us possess that faith ourselves. For **a faith that overcomes, is a faith that saves.**
